AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 57 OF ORDINANCE NO. 1 AS AMENDED RELATING TO CONNECTION CHARGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF ROCKLIN-LOOMIS MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section No. 57 of Ordinance No. 1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

The connection charge shall be (\$275.00) two hundred and seventy-five dollars. The connection charge for commercial establishments having in excess of 25 fixture units shall be determined by the Board for each specific application. The connection charge for industrial processing plants for the disposal of industrial wastes shall be determined by the Board for each specific application. The connection charge for trailers shall be (\$275.00) two hundred seventy-five dollars per unit and the connection charge for homes in an approved subdivision shall be a minimum charge of (\$275.00) two hundred seventy-five dollars per unit provided that the subdivider provides the intract facilities with delivery of the sewage to a main as designated by the District.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after the 8th day of April, 1965.

The adjourned meeting was called to order at 8:15 P. M., with President Gates presiding.

President Gates informed all those present that the District's attorney, Mr. William Sweigert, had advised the Board to take no action on Ordinance #7 at tonights meeting.

Director Barnes made a motion, seconded by Director Aitken, that upon the advice of the District's attorney, the Board take no action on the District's Ordinance #7 at this time.

The motion carried unanimously. Director Hebuck and Kosanvich -- absent.

In answer to Mr. Lindsay's questions, President Gates stated that the Board's action tonight automatically nullified Ordinance #7 and that a new ordinance would have to be introduced amending subdivision connection charges.

Mr. Leo Manning informed the Board that he had received a letter from the school district relative to connection charges for the new school in Rollingwood and, since he expected title to the Miner's Ravine plant to be cleared within two weeks, requested, in writing, the Board's policy regarding school hookup fees as a formula to follow in fixing the connection rates for the new school. He stated that he would like to keep in line with District policy as the hookup fee would be a credit towards the plant in the event of District control.

Mr. Gates, speaking as an individual member of the Foard, stated that the previous formula used by the District for school contracts was figured on the average daily attendance and projected enrollment, but that the policy is somewhat flexible, depending on different factors involved.

Mr. Gates referred Mr. Manning to the District's financial consultant, Mr. Wells, and the District's engineer, Mr. Lovelace for their opinion regarding hookup fees for the Rollingwood school.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to the call of the chair, on the motion of Director Barnes at 8:25 P. M.
